
## **Exchange Program**

There are approximately 420,000 Uchinanchu around the world! As of 2024, an estimated 420,000 Uchinanchu (Okinawan descendants) live overseas. By maintaining strong connections between Uchinanchu communities in various countries and those living in Okinawa, rich cultural exchanges are fostered with countries around the globe.
